As the seasons change, I pause to think about the changes at Seashore Gardens Living Center (SGLC). We are working on many new and exciting programs and projects, and also realizing the fulfillment of some long-held dreams. None of this would be possible without collaboration, cooperation and generosity of both funds and spirit.

Grant-Funded Programming

We have been fortunate to receive grant funding from the Association of Jewish Aging Services (AJAS) to implement two amazing, proven programs for our residents: Opening Minds Through Art and Music & Memory. Opening Minds through Art was founded in 2007 by Dr. Elizabeth Lokon and is grounded in person-centered care principles. In our inaugural season, residents with Dementia are being paired with Occupational Therapy students from Stockton University to create art while building meaningful one-on-one relationships. Music & Memory was founded in 2006 by Dan Cohen and utilizes personalized playlists tailored to our residents. We are grateful that AJAS chose SGLC as one of their member organizations to be a recipient of these programs for the next three years.







Expanding Their World Online



The June B. Cohen Family Connection Fund, Sephardic Home Foundation and Odessa and Harry Kahrs Fund allowed us to finish the Wi-Fi Project on our 2 North and 2 South neighborhoods and to FINALLY purchase the large screen IN2L computer system that is residing on 2 South. Thank you! As we search for funding to renovate this skilled nursing neighborhood where our total care residents live, we are heartened to see our residents "feeding the fish,"

traveling around the world and 'Skyping' with their families. This 60-inch computer screen and its monthly content are expanding their worlds and allowing them to experience things and visit places without leaving their chairs. On Giving Tuesday, December 3, we will be asking for donations to bolster the June B. Cohen Family Connection Fund to further provide this vital connection for our residents.

Intergenerational Experiences

We have known for years that intergenerational programs benefit our residents in countless ways. With the help of the Sephardic Home for the Aged Foundation, AJAS, and Harry R. Katz, along with a micro grant from the Jewish Federation Foundation, we were able to partner with the BJE and self-fund the beloved Better Together Program. Previously underwritten by the Legacy Heritage Foundation, the program is now in its third year at SGLC. This year's theme is "Mussar and the Making of a Mensch." The residents and their young friends meet monthly on a Sunday afternoon. This theme works so well with the Mussar, Meditation and Mindfulness program that our Assistant Administrator Michelle Matino has initiated with our residents weekly. Of course, our In2L computer systems enhance these programs with sensory images and soothing music. Recently, we sent a beautifully illustrated card as an appeal to donate to our intergenerational programs. Not only did the card depict various activities but the artwork on the cover was done by our residents.



Life & Legacy

We are halfway through our second year in the Life & Legacy Program. We were so excited to surpass our goal and receive an incentive grant that enabled us to purchase two pieces of medical equipment requested by our staff. We now have a bladder scan machine that enables us to simply test our residents and avoid unnecessary hospitalizations. We also now have a state-of-the-art computerized parallel bars system in our Rehabilitation gym. As an independent, nonprofit Home for the Aged, we are continuously challenged to find solutions that will enable us to provide more and more resources for our residents and their families. Being part of Life & Legacy will allow not only SGLC but the other fine organizations in our cohort to exist for generations to come.

The residents of SGLC are an average age of 92 years old. Baby boomers are starting to age into living here or are needing short-term rehabilitation stays. Residents are aging in place and we are starting to really see the changing face of aging. We are humbled to have the enormous privilege to share these golden years with them. Seashore Gardens Foundation Annual Gala



Board Member Spotlight Leslie Steinberg

When Leslie Steinberg's father, Jerome Pohl, needed rehab back in 2014, she didn't hesitate. She and her family took him to Seashore Gardens Living Center (SGLC). "We had a comfort level with a Jewish home," she said, remembering that her grandfather had received wonderful care at the Jewish Home for the Aged back in Buffalo. She was thrilled to find that her father bonded with SGLC staff to the point that he still comes back today to have lunch and visit.



That rehab stay was followed by a short-term Assisted Living stay for her father

while repairs were being made to his home. Then, Leslie's mother, Helen "Tootsie" Pohl, moved into the 2 South neighborhood for hospice care. After her mother passed, Leslie's father had four separate surgeries and was in need of rehab again.

"It was a highly emotional time and everyone was so caring and helpful," remembered Leslie. "My father turned 90 while he was at Seashore Gardens and we had a party for 40 guests in the theater. Jill LaBoy put together a terrific menu, including kosher chicken wings and a brownie cake."

So it didn't take much persuasion for Leslie to join the Board when asked by friend and neighbor Richard Cohen. She's a recent member, joining just this past winter. Leslie also is on the committee for the 5K Run/ Health Walk, and has participated in the past with husband Richard and dog Chase (in a stroller). The cause is dear to her heart, as her mother suffered from dementia. "I can't tell you how happy I am that Seashore Gardens exists for those who need it," she said.

When asked about her activities at the annual golf tournament, Fran said her involvement went "soup to nuts," meaning she worked on registration, made


